Education

- Add details of all qualifications you've already achieved, such as GCSEs, A levels and EP. Add anything you are currently studying for, or resits, as pending.
- 'Add place of education' with start and end dates.
- Then 'Add qualification'.
- Adding the EP is compulsory. Extended Project (Level 3) from the dropdown, title of your project in the 'subject' field, OCR.
- If you are taking resits you will need to register with the Exams office in November. Check their [website](#) and email exams@hrsfc.ac.uk with questions. On the UCAS application put the exam(s) under a new entry for Hills Road, part-time, May to June 2025.
- Predicted grades for resits will be one grade above either what you achieved in Aug 24 or what you were originally predicted at the end of Year 12, whichever is higher.

Admissions Tests:

- Some courses at some universities will require you to sit an Admissions Test. In general, if you are applying to Oxford or Cambridge or to Medicine & Dentistry at any university, you are likely to need to sit a test. Some universities also require tests for Law and Maths and occasionally other subjects. On your UCAS application these will show in blue text on the choice card.
- **It is *YOUR* responsibility to ensure you are entered for the appropriate test.** Look at the course website for each university you apply to. There is further information on the [UCAS website](#). If in doubt speak to Careers.
- **STEP** for Maths admissions at University of Cambridge and some other universities; sat at Hills Road in June 2025. You will need to contact the [Exams Office](#) about this. Email them to find out how to register: exams@hillsroad.ac.uk

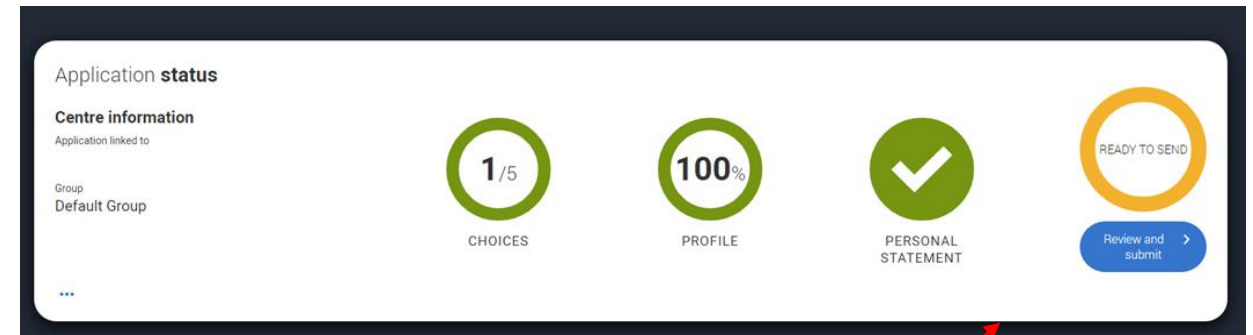

Choices

- There is a maximum of **five** choices and choice restrictions may apply.
A maximum of **four** courses from medicine, dentistry, veterinary medicine or veterinary science, and either the University of Oxford OR the University of Cambridge.
- **Once choices are added you must mark the section as complete to be able to submit.**
- Choices are not added in any preference order. Universities/colleges cannot see where else you've applied to.

How to Pay & Submit



1. Your UCAS profile on your Hub must be complete and showing '**Ready to Send**' before being able to '**Review and submit**'.
2. At the bottom of the application, click '**Accept and proceed**' (or return to application if you want to make more changes).
3. Check, and where necessary, update your marketing preferences.
4. Tick the box at the bottom of the page - '**Accept and proceed**' - to confirm you have read and understood the terms and conditions.
5. **Free school meals only:** select the '**Pay Centre**' option – your fees are waived.
6. **Everyone else:** select '**Pay by card**' and you will be asked to enter your card details. The fee is £28.50.

Process after you have paid and submitted

- Make sure you come to the Gap Year Personal Statement day on 30th August – you can show your personal statement to your tutor then. After this, you can email it to your tutor but they may not have the time to check it.
- When you've paid and submitted your application, it will go to Careers at Hills Road to check and add the reference and predicted grades (where applicable eg for resits).
- If there are amends you will be emailed. When you've responded, Careers will unlock your application so that you can log on and make the amends.
- Careers will then send the application to UCAS. They aim to send applications to UCAS within four working weeks of you paying and sending, as long as you respond to requests to make amendments.
- Please email careers@hrsfc.ac.uk if you have any questions about your application.

Don't forget!

- Email address – use a personal one, not Hills Road.
- GCSEs (or equivalent), with results, under your secondary school. Most students will enter GCSE (9-1).
 - Combined Science GCSE – add this as 2 GCSEs, with both grades.
- GCE Advanced Levels (A-Levels), grades, check exam boards.
- If you are adding extra qualifications such as sport, music or dance, please add these under the teacher/institute you studied at – you can add these manually. Please add only the highest level achieved/working towards.
- Choices - you can add 1 or 2 choices now and add the rest through UCAS Hub when your application has been sent to UCAS.
- **Extended Project (level 3)** must be included under Hills Road (unless officially exempt), with title of your project in the 'subject' field, grade, OCR.
