Register via UCAS HUB

- Go to <https://www.ucas.com/> - select 'sign in' - select 'students' and 'Create account' within the 2024-entry option.
- If you already have an account - in 'Preferences' make sure you choose the correct study year, 2024.
- Use a personal email address, not Hills Road.
- To start your UCAS application click on the 'Your application' tile.
- Link to Hills Road - enter our **Buzzword Hills24**
- Use the ? icon at the bottom of each section to get more help with answering the questions.



Don't forget!

- Email address – use a personal one, not Hills Road.
- GCSEs (or equivalent), with results, under your secondary school.
 - Combined Science GCSE – either choose ‘other’ under grades and input x-x manually, or, choose ‘GCSE: Double Award (9-9 to 1-1)’.
- GCE Advanced Levels (A-Levels), grades, check exam boards.
- Highest level of qualification you expect to have before you start your course: Below honours degree level qualifications.
- Choices - you can add 1 or 2 choices now and add the rest through UCAS Hub when your application has been sent to UCAS.
- Show your personal statement to your tutor before paying and submitting.



Don't forget!

- **Extended Project (level 3)** must be included under Hills Road (unless officially exempt), with title of your project in the 'subject' field, grade, OCR.



Education

- Add details of all qualifications you've already achieved, such as GCSEs, A levels and EP. Add anything you are currently studying for, or resits, as pending.
- 'Add place of education' with start and end dates.
- Then 'Add qualification'.
- Adding the EP is compulsory. Extended Project (Level 3) from the dropdown, title of your project in the 'subject' field, OCR.
- 'Highest level of qualification you expect to have before you start your course' = 'Below honours degree level'.
- If you are taking resits you will need to register with the Exams office in November. Check their [website](#) and email exams@hrsfc.ac.uk with questions. On the UCAS application put the exam(s) under a new entry for Hills Road, part-time, May-June 2024.
- Predicted grades for resits will be one grade above either what you achieved in Aug 23 or what you were originally predicted at the end of Year 12, whichever is higher.

Admissions Tests:

- Some courses at some universities will require you to sit an Admissions Test. In general, if you are applying to Oxford or Cambridge or to Medicine & Dentistry at any university, you are likely to need to sit a test. Some universities also require tests for Law and Maths and occasionally other subjects. On your UCAS application these will show in blue text on the choice card.
- **It is *YOUR* responsibility to ensure you are entered for the appropriate test.** Look at the course website for each university you apply to. There is further information on the UCAS website. If in doubt speak to Careers.
- All tests administered by Cambridge Assessment Admission Testing are booked through the Hills Road Examinations Office and sat at Hills Road in late October (with the exception of the Maths STEP exam which is taken in June alongside A levels). The College deadlines for tests are **ten days before** the dates on exam board and university websites. The link to the application form will be sent via email and it will be on the Exams Office page of the College website.
- LNAT and UCAT tests are sat at the Pearson Professional Centre in Cambridge City Centre; follow the link for details.
- **Paying for Tests:** for those on a low income, some tests offer bursary support. You can also ask in Student Services if the cost of tests is an issue.



Supporting Information

- 'More about you' - Information completed here is not used to make a decision on your application. It's only shared with those involved in supporting you, or making the arrangements for support.
- Employment – enter paid employment here. Work experience/volunteering in personal statement.



This tells the universities and colleges which year of the course you want to start, e.g. point of entry one is the first year of the course. If you wish to start in the first year of the course leave the box blank and you will automatically be considered for the first year. Enter 0 if you intend to take a foundation year – not all universities offer a foundation year so please check before applying.

If you've spoken to your chosen university or college and they are willing to consider your application to start the course after the first year, please enter the relevant number for the year, e.g. second year = 2, third year = 3, etc.

Process

- Show your personal statement and choices to your tutor before you pay and submit.
- When you've paid (£27.50) and submitted your application, it will go to Careers at Hills Road to check and add the reference.
- If there are amends you will be emailed. When you've responded, Careers will unlock your application so that you can logon and make the amends.
- Careers will then send the application to UCAS. They aim to send applications to UCAS within four weeks of you paying and sending, as long as you respond to requests to make amendments.
